Management Student Spotlight

Kelby Wenger, a junior Management student, recently saved another's life by donating her stem cells. Wenger signed up for the Bone Marrow Registry on campus in spring 2010. The registry contacted Wenger this past fall semester with news that she was a potential match for a 63-year-old man with leukemia. Wenger received another call a month later after a round of preliminary health questions and having her blood work done. She was told she was the best match and would be donating not bone marrow, but peripheral blood stem cells.

"In about three weeks I'll find out how my recipient is doing," said Wenger. "I care for him and am praying for him all the time. I don't know him, but I know I love him."
