Discussed Items

1. Members of the committee acknowledged receipt of the minutes from the February 25<sup>th</sup> meeting and the minutes were accepted as distributed.
2. John Root reminded the committee members to continue to fill out the evaluation forms when they eat in the facilities. This is a critical part of our duties and the main reason that we receive the 30 block plan for participating in the food committee.

4. John reported that for the April meeting Charles and Richard would have the proposed price increase and market comparison ready for the committee to review.

5. John reported that he and Charles have decided to have a contest during the first week in April when residence students will have the opportunity to guess the day and meal period that SWT will serve its One Millionth Dining Hall Residence Meal. This would be since the start of the fall semester and currently this should happen sometime between now and the end of the spring semester. The winner will win a mountain bike. The contest is so that students get an appreciation for the amount of meals that we serve in a given academic year.
  
6. Charles Blackwell gave the committee a presentation on the possible new concepts and changes that he is proposing for the fall 2003 / spring 2003 academic year. Each committee member received a copy of Charles power point slides for their review. Among the topics discussed was the continuing use of meal trades. Currently our students each 58% of their residence dining meals as meal trades in Jones, Den, or LBJ. Charles and John both feel that we need to add an additional meal trade venue on campus. The committee discussed the possibility of putting a Subway in the Harris Underground location. Additionally Charles wants to add Coyote Jacks Grill, Magic Cajun Kitchen, and others to upgrade and draw more patrons to Harris. Eventually we would add enough concepts to Harris Underground to make it a thriving food court. In Jones Charles would like to replace Sbarro's with Tuscany Café, a signature corporate brand. Also he would replace Origins with Bobcats Home Cookery, an in house concept that brings back home style recipes. We are still investigating the coffee house concept for the Mugs location and putting a TCBY and Mrs. Fields Cookies in the current Cappella's location. Plans for the Den would be dependent somewhat on what we do in the Harris location.

The meeting adjourned at 5:15pm.
