NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both ACC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. This transfer planning guide is "Core Complete."
2. Courses with an asterisk (*) satisfy the Business Field of Study (FOS) curriculum. This guide is "FOS Complete."
3. Nine hours of designated "writing intensive" (WI) courses must be completed at Texas State to satisfy degree requirements.
4. This transfer planning guide shows a suggested course of study at both institutions. Students may want to consider taking select courses in summer semesters instead, provided that they are offered and are in the correct sequence needed for their degree and major program.
5. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
6. Students are allowed a maximum of 66 transferable hours from a two-year college.
7. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to ACC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."
8. Students transferring with less than 30 hours will be required to take US 1100.

TEXAS STATE ADMISSION PROCEDURES

MCCOY COLLEGE OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION ADMISSION:

Admission to the McCoy College is competitive, and admission requirements are beyond those for Texas State. As a result, a student may be admitted to Texas State, but denied admission to the McCoy College. The student must be admitted to the McCoy College to pursue a degree program under the college.

To be eligible to apply for admission to McCoy College, students must meet Texas State admission requirements and must have completed at least 30 transferable semester hours including ENG 1310 (College Writing I) and ENG 1320 (College Writing II), and MATH 1329 (Mathematics for Business and Economics II), or their equivalents. Applicants will be automatically admitted to McCoy College when they have an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher. Applicants with an overall GPA below a 3.0 will be considered for admission through a competitive review process. The review is based on the grades earned in English 1310, English 1320, Math 1329 and the overall GPA from all colleges and universities attended.

To apply to McCoy College you must select the business major of your choice as your first major option on the ApplyTexas Application. The application deadlines for admission to the McCoy College are:

October 15 for Spring semesters

March 15 for Summer/ Fall semesters

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

For general university admission, students must submit a completed ApplyTexas Application form, application fee, and official transcripts from each institution attended to the Texas State Office of Undergraduate Admissions. Students must submit an application for on-campus housing, if required, or apply to live off campus.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a community college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the community college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University and the McCoy College requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/suspension, and other general information.
