NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both ACC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. Courses in (parentheses) indicate the course transfer equivalents at Texas State. Courses with an asterisk (*) must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
2. Texas State will apply to a degree up to 66 hours from an accredited two-year college (6-8 hours may be added with college dean approval.)
3. Students may elect to complete courses in a different sequence where possible, but should consult a counselor/advisor before doing so.
4. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.

TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY-SAN MARCOS

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

1. Submit completed application form and all credentials to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions by the stated admission deadline (Fall-July 1, Spring-December 1, Summer I-May 1, Summer II-June 15).
2. Submit an official transcript from each institution attended to the Office of Undergraduate Admissions.
3. A minimum 2.25 grade point average (GPA) in all transferable courses is required.
4. Submit an application for on-campus housing, if required, or apply to live off campus.

ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION PROGRAM:

During the first semester on campus, a student who plans to receive teacher certification must attend a Teacher Education Information Meeting. Dates and times for these meetings offered each semester are posted on the Center for Student and Professional Services website, www.education.txstate.edu/advising. Pre-teacher education students will be shown how to submit their preliminary application for teacher education and will learn about the requirements for formal admission to teacher education.

Once a student has completed 45-60 semester credit hours of coursework leading to teacher certification, formal admission into teacher education is required.

Requirements for formal admission into the teacher education program include:

1. 2.50 or higher Texas State GPA
2. Acceptable writing sample
3. 15 hours of service learning experience with students from multicultural backgrounds
4. Three letters of recommendation (service learning supervisor, university professor, personal reference)
5. Acceptable criminal background check
6. Texas Higher Education Assessment (THEA) scores of at least 220 in writing and 230 in reading and mathematics or documentation of exemptions or equivalencies.
7. College level skills in reading, oral and written communication, critical thinking, and mathematics:
 - a. Reading: Successful completion of PHIL 1305, PHIL 1320, or equivalent
 - b. Oral Communication: Successful completion of COMM 1310 or equivalent
 - c. Written Communication: Completion of ENG 1310 and 1320 with grades of "C" or better
 - d. Critical Thinking: Successful completion of PHIL 1305, PHIL 1320, or equivalent
 - e. Mathematics: Completion of MATH 1315, 1319, 2417, or 2471 with a grade of "C" or better

Upon meeting the requirements for admission, a student must pay a \$200.00 admission to teacher education fee. This fee includes the cost of access to Live Text, the Department of Curriculum and Instruction assessment system, the student's background check, and administrative costs.

ADMISSION TO STUDENT TEACHING:

1. Admission to Teacher Education.
2. A Texas State GPA of 2.5 or higher.
3. Validation of required pre-student teaching field experiences.
4. A grade of "C" or higher in all assigned courses in the professional sequence prior to student teaching.
5. A GPA of at least 2.50 in the teaching field(s) or specialization(s) with no grade below a "C".
6. Approval from the chair of the department of the student's major teaching field.
