<sup>2</sup> Select one ENGL course from the Humanities component area (040) of Texas State's Core Curriculum list.

<sup>3</sup> Professional development sequences are individualized to students' educational needs. Students will choose courses with the assistance of the degree advisor from at least three academic departments. This module of 18 hours constitutes the major for GPA calculation purposes.

**NOTES:**

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both NVC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. Courses in (parentheses) indicate the course transfer equivalents at Texas State.
2. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
3. Texas State will apply to a degree up to 66 hours from an accredited two-year college (6-8 hours may be added with college dean approval.)
4. Students may elect to complete courses in a different sequence where possible, but should consult a counselor/advisor before doing so.

## TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY-SAN MARCOS

### UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

1. Submit completed Texas Common Application form, \$40 application fee, and an official transcript from each institution attended to the Undergraduate Admissions Office by the stated admission deadline (Fall-July 1, Spring-December 1, Summer I-May 1, Summer II-June 15).
2. A minimum 2.25 grade point average (GPA) in all transferable courses is required.
3. As applicable, submit an application for on-campus housing, if required, or apply to live off campus.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a two-year college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the two-year college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University and College requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/suspension, and other general information.
