NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both SWTJC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements. Courses in (parentheses) indicate the course transfer equivalents at Texas State.
2. Texas State will apply to a degree up to 66 hours from an accredited two-year college (6-8 hours may be added with college dean approval.)
3. Students may elect to complete courses in a different sequence where possible, but should consult a counselor/advisor before doing so.
4. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
5. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to SWTJC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."
6. Please refer to the backside of this guide for pre-veterinary program information and curriculum requirements.

TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY-SAN MARCOS

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

1. Submit completed Texas Common Application, \$40 application fee, and all credentials to the Undergraduate Admissions Office by the stated admission deadline (Fall-July 1, Spring-December 1, Summer I-May 1, Summer II-June 15).
2. Submit an official transcript from each institution attended to the Undergraduate Admissions Office.
3. A minimum 2.25 grade point average (GPA) in all transferable courses is required.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a two-year college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the two-year college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University and College requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/ suspension, and other general information.

Pre-Veterinary Medicine. The only College of Veterinary Medicine in Texas is at Texas A&M University. Prior to admission, students must complete at least 64 hours of course work, which constitutes a pre-veterinary program. At Texas State, all students must choose a major in one of the 4-year bachelor's programs. While any major is acceptable, majors in Agriculture/Animal Science, Biology or Chemistry most nearly parallel the courses required in the pre-veterinary program which are as follows: AG 3301 or BIO 2450, AG 3325 or 4325; BIO 1430, 2400; CHEM 1141/1341, 1142/1342, 2141/2341, 3375 or 4375 ENG 1310, 3 hours literature, 3303; COMM 2330 or 2338; MATH 1329 or 2321 or 2331 or 3305 or AG 3352; and PHYS 1410 & 1420.
