NOTES:

1. *Italicized* courses satisfy both TC and Texas State Core Curriculum requirements.
2. No more than 15 CRIJ hours may be transferred and those 15 hours must be composed of the core (CRIJ 1301, 1306, 1310, 2313, and 2328).
3. This transfer planning guide shows a suggested course of study at both institutions. Students may elect to complete courses in a different sequence where possible.
4. If two years of the same foreign language were not completed in high school, students must take 6-8 hours of the same foreign language.
5. Students are allowed a maximum of 74 transferable hours from a two-year college.
6. Upon completion of certain course requirements at Texas State, students may elect to send these hours back to TC to be applied toward an associate's degree. This is commonly referred to as "reverse transfer."

TEXAS STATE UNIVERSITY-SAN MARCOS

UNIVERSITY ADMISSION:

For general university admission, students must submit a completed Texas Common Application form, \$40 application fee, and official transcripts from each institution attended to the Texas State Undergraduate Admissions Office. Students must submit an application for on-campus housing, if required, or apply to live off campus.

Students transferring directly to Texas State University-San Marcos from a two-year college may elect to follow the Texas State catalog in effect at the time they entered the two-year college, or any subsequent catalog upon approval of the Dean of their College. Students are reminded to refer to their designated catalog for information relating to the University and College requirements for curriculum, graduation, probation/ suspension, and other general information.
