

# ATI TEAS Exam for Prospective Nursing Students

The ATI TEAS exam for prospective nursing students is administered by appointment only in the Testing Center at Texas State University Round Rock Campus (RRC). All prospective nursing students, regardless of the college or university they plan to attend, are welcome to test in the Center. Please plan to take ATI TEAS exam early in the admissions process, to allow scores to be available prior to the application deadline.

## The Exam

The ATI TEAS is a 209-minute exam (about 3½ hours) to assess reading, mathematics, science and language usage skills.

Because seating is limited, students are urged to make their ATI TEAS testing appointment with the Testing Center at Texas State Round Rock Campus at least a week in advance. Appointments may be requested by emailing [rrc-testing@txstate.edu](mailto:rrc-testing@txstate.edu). The test is administered at 2 p.m. Monday through Thursday, or at 1 p.m. when classes are not in session. PLEASE PLAN AHEAD for your January 2020 application!

An appointment confirmation will be emailed and will include instructions, directions to the campus, parking information and a link for online payment for the proctoring and the exam. The proctoring fee is \$60, and the exam fee is \$58, for a total of \$118. Payments may be refunded for only one week.

Appointments must be cancelled at least 48 hours prior to the exam appointment time, or the student will be considered a "no show." Two "no shows" and the student will forfeit ATI TEAS testing privileges in the Center.

## ID Requirement

**Students must present a valid, current Texas driver's license or state ID, a U.S. passport, a military ID or a permanent resident card when checking in for the exam at the front desk in Suite 201, the ONE STOP CENTER, in the Avery Building.**

## Parking

- Parking is \$5, unless the student's vehicle has a current Texas State parking sticker. Payment may be made at the small, unmanned kiosk in the parking lot. The machine is designated with a "P," and credit cards are accepted.
