Types of Financial Aid

GRANTS . WORK-STUDY . LOANS

To apply for financial aid, students must complete the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) at **studentaid.gov/ fafsa**. The earlier you complete the FAFSA, the more likely you are to receive aid.

- You can submit the FAFSA as early as October 1

- Priority deadline: January 15

Assured Scholarships

Awarded automatically to students ranked in the top 35% of their graduating class or completing the IB Diploma or AP Capstone Diploma, and meeting SAT/ACT score minimums. Specific qualifications can be found on our website. TXST is conducting holistic reviews of students without SAT or ACT scores for possible merit scholarship awards.

National Scholarships

Students designated as a National Merit Finalist and/or a National Hispanic Scholar, and meeting Texas State scholarship requirements, will be awarded scholarships from Texas State. Specific qualifications can be found on our website.

Competitive Scholarships

Awards range from \$2,000 to \$108,000 over four years. Application deadline: **December 15**

To apply for competitive scholarships, you must:

- 1. be admitted to Texas State
- 2. meet Assured Admission standards
- complete the General and Freshman scholarship application in the Bobcat Online Scholarship System (BOSS) at boss.txst.edu

Combine Your Scholarship Packages

For example, if you qualify for both a National Distinction Scholarship and a President's Honor Scholarship, your combined total award could be \$88,000 over four years.

Texas State's Annual Security Reports and Fire Safety Report

We value the safety of all members of the Texas State University community at our main campus in San Marcos, TX and separate campuses in Maxwell, TX (ALERRT Campus) and Round Rock, TX. Texas State publishes a combined Annual Security and Fire Safety Report that contains information regarding campus safety and security including topics such as: campus law enforcement authority; crime reporting policies; campus alerts (Timely Warnings and Emergency Notifications); fire safety policies and procedures; programs to prevent dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault and stalking; the procedures the University will follow when one of these crimes is reported; and other matters of importance related to security on campus. The report also contains information about crime statistics for the three most recent calendar years concerning reported crimes that occurred on campus; in on-campus student housing facilities; in noncampus buildings or property owned or controlled by the University or a recognized student organization; and on public property within, or immediately adjacent to and accessible from, the campus. The report also provides fire statistics for any fires occurring in an on-campus student housing facility during the three most recent calendar years. The Fire Safety Report section and on-campus student housing statistics do not apply to Round Rock or the ALERRT Center, as those campuses do not currently have any student housing facilities.
