Human Resources Code Sec. 42.068	HB 1540	Failure to post required "No Trespassing" notice at residential treatment center.	Class C misdemeanor (\$1-500 fine range)
Penal Code Sec. 48.05	HB 1925	Intentionally or knowingly camping in a public place without the effective consent of the officer or agency having the legal duty or authority to manage the public place.	Class C misdemeanor (\$1-500 fine range)
Penal Code Sec. 30.05(d-3)	HB 1927	Entering the property, land, or building with a firearm or other weapon and the sole basis on which entry on the property or land or in the building was forbidden is that entry with a firearm or other weapon was forbidden.	\$1-200 fine range; except Class A if receives notice as provided by statute and fails to depart.
Agriculture Code Sec. 161.0445	HB 1958	Knowingly moving an animal in violation of a rule adopted under this section.	Class C misdemeanor (\$1-500 fine range)
Transportation Code Sec. 545.157	HB 2048	Adds "vehicle operated by or pursuant to a contract with a toll project entity, as defined by Section 372.001, using visual signals that comply with the standards and specifications adopted under Section 547.105" to the list of emergency vehicles a driver must either slow down or move over when passing on the shoulder.	\$1-200 fine; \$1-500 fine if offense results in property damage; (Class B misdemeanor if offense results in bodily injury.)
Transportation Code Sec. 730.0122	SB 15	Selling to a person who is not an authorized recipient personal information obtained by an agency in connection with a motor vehicle record.	\$1-100,000 fine range
Transportation Code Sec. 730.013	SB 15	Rediscovering the personal information described in the statute, including redisclosure for compensation, to a person who is not an authorized recipient, or failing to notify recipient that the information may not be disclosed.	\$1-100,000 fine range
Transportation Code Sec. 730.016	SB 15	Failing to delete from the person's records all personal information received under this chapter one year after the date of conviction or the court's final determination under this Subsection.	\$1-100,000 fine range
Education Code Sec. 44.052(c)	SB 1365	Adds "voting to expend school funds in violation of a provision of the Education Code or for a purpose for which those funds may not be spent" to prohibited actions.	Class C misdemeanor (\$1-500 fine range)
