University Housing Policy

New incoming, first-time freshmen under the age of 20 (by September 1 for fall admission or January 1 for spring admission) with fewer than 30 credit hours are required to live in on-campus university housing. All students who graduated from high school within the preceding 12 months of the semester of their admission are also required to live on campus.

Living in on-campus housing is the best way to connect and become part of the Bobcat community. Here are some of the advantages:

- You can participate in academic and social activities.
- On-site professional staff are dedicated to helping you succeed.
- It's a short walk to your classes, library, student center, and recreation center.
- You can stay connected through Wireless Internet connectivity.
- You will enjoy a variety of dining options with generous portions and healthy alternatives.
- Students who live on campus typically have higher GPAs and are more likely to graduate from the university.
