President, Vice President and Chief of Staff Learn More about the Round Rock Higher Education Center

SAN MARCOS, TEXAS- On Thursday, June 14th, Associated Student Government Student Body President Nathan McDaniel, Student Body Vice President Alison Sibley, and Chief of Staff Vanessa Cortez, visited the Texas State Round Rock Higher Education Center (RRHEC).

Last fall, former Student Body President Albert James DeGarmo, appointed a newly created liaison position for the RRHEC after seeing a need for a stronger Associated Student Government presence at their campus. Because of this, President McDaniel felt an inherent need for the executive to get a better perspective of student life at RRHEC.

Jill Seidenberger, RRHEC Student Development Specialist, and Molly Foster, former RRHEC Liaison, gave the three Executive Officers a tour of campus and informed them of all the amenities and resources their campus has to offer.

Seidenberger and Foster began the tour in the One Stop Center of the Avery building. The One Stop Center is the central location where students go for registration, veteran's affairs, academic advising, and more.

Throughout the buildings, McDaniel, Sibley, and Cortez found many common areas for students to study, relax, or eat a meal. Ample computer labs are readily available for students to access as well as printing services. A small cafeteria is also provided and is catered by Chartwells. Like Texas State-San Marcos, the RRHEC offers a Writing Center for students and a Counseling Center that is run by graduate students seeking a degree in counseling.

President McDaniel, Vice President Sibley, and Chief of Staff Cortez had the opportunity to get an in depth look at the St. David's School of Nursing, which was just accredited this past year by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education's Board. Students in the nursing school are fortunate enough to practice in simulation labs and use state of the art equipment, such as a high-end manikin called the SimMan® 3g. The nursing school is highly competitive and only admits 100 students every fall

semester. Doors first opened to students in 2010 and this past spring graduated its first class of students.

President McDaniel, Vice President Sibley, and Chief of Staff Cortez were so grateful for the tour they were given by their wonderful tour guides and look forward to working closely to help be the voice of students for not only Texas State-San Marcos but Texas State RRHEC as well.
