Administrative Fellowship

Operations

Over the course of one year, Operation Fellows are exposed to a broad range of hands-on experiences that will prepare them for a successful career in healthcare leadership. Fellows are provided areas of concentration according to their own interests, career objectives, and organizational needs.

Revenue Cycle

Revenue Cycle Fellows spend 24 months rotating through several aspects of finance and the revenue cycle across the entire health system, including patient access services, health information management, and revenue cycle analytics. Fellows also experience other areas related to their own interests, career objectives, and organizational needs.

Finance

Finance Fellows rotate for 24 months through various aspects of the hospitals, clinics, and corporate office in order to understand the complex day to day financial activities in healthcare. Fellows concentrate on areas associated with finance and revenue cycle, as well as those areas related to their own expressed interests, career objectives, and organizational needs.

Supply Chain

Supply Chain Fellows spend 12-18 months in a training program that combines system-wide exposure to major functional areas within Ochsner with classroom learning, executive shadowing, a wide range of intensive project work, and a multitude of professional development modules.

Nursing

Nursing Fellows will be exposed to a broad range of hands-on experiences throughout the course of one year in order to prepare them for a successful career in healthcare leadership. This program utilizes the competencies of the American Organization of Nurse Executives to help guide program content and ensure a successful learning application.
