IMPORTANT DEGREE INFORMATION

BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. Regardless of major or minor, candidates for a Bachelor of Arts degree must meet the following requirements:

Modern Language Requirement. Completion of intermediate-level language (2310 and 2320.)

English Requirement. Completion of two sophomore literature courses (6-hours) selected from English 2310, 2320, 2330, 2340, 2359, or 2360.

Science Requirement. In addition to completing the mathematics and natural science requirements of the general education core curriculum, students must complete one additional science course (3-4 hours) from anthropology (biological anthropology only), biology, chemistry, computer science, geography (physical geography only), mathematics, philosophy (logic only), and physics.

Minor Requirement. A minor is required and may be selected from any of the Texas State approved minors (excluding the economics minor).

TRANSFER COURSE WORK. A maximum of 66-hours from a community college may be transferred into Texas State to apply toward the BBA degree. Courses acceptable for transfer to Texas State will transfer at the level at which the courses were taken (i.e., acceptable business courses from two-year schools transfer as freshman or sophomore courses and may not be used to satisfy junior/senior level business course requirements).

36 HOURS OF ADVANCED COURSEWORK REQUIREMENT. Students must choose upper-division (3000- or 4000-level) courses for minor and free electives to meet the minimum requirement of 36 hours of advanced courses at Texas State.

OTHER DEGREE REQUIREMENTS. Students must complete at least 120 semester hours, satisfy course requirements specified above and on their degree audit (including general education core, foreign language, writing intensive, and advanced hours) and achieve minimum grade point averages as follows: 2.0 Texas State GPA, 2.25 Major GPA and a 2.0 Minor GPA.

DEGREE SUMMARY. Each student may access their degree plan through Degree Works on CatsWeb (<https://sbs.txstate.edu>) by clicking the "Student" link and then "Degree Audit." Students should consult with the McCoy College of Business Advising Center (McCoy Hall 115) during the semester prior to the semester in which they plan to graduate.

APPLICATION FOR GRADUATION. Students must apply to graduate online via CatsWeb (<http://www.catsweb.txstate.edu/students.html>). Additionally, students must check with the McCoy College of Business Advising Center (McCoy Hall 115) during the first week of the semester in which they expect to graduate (September for fall, January for spring, or June for summer) for clearance to participate in commencement.

HONORS DESIGNATION. To be eligible to graduate with honors, students must complete a minimum of 54 credit hours through Texas State and have earned a 3.4 or higher Texas State GPA.

PREREQUISITES. Course prerequisites are not listed on this sheet. Check the current catalog to verify any prerequisites.
