**SUBJ:** 2015-2017 Parking Policy Recommendations

I'm sending this letter along with the legislation passed by the Senate on September 8<sup>th</sup>. I sent these documents to Ms. Nancy Nusbaum prior to her meeting with President's Cabinet on September 29<sup>th</sup> where she outlined her department's policy change recommendations.

Here is a summary of what Student Government endorsed and opposed:

For convenience I will summarize the items we endorsed:

#### FY 2015/2016

- 1. Making Speck Street Garage open to Perimeter, "purple", permit holders only.
  - As noted in Nancy's presentation on September 8 the grange will be made available to all permit holders after 5:00 p.m. on weekdays and all day on weekends.
- 2. Grant access to Perimeter, "purple", permit holders on Academy Street Garage's first level if Residence Hall, "green", permit holders are not using it.
- 3. Reducing the "permit free" period in Perimeter lots from two weeks to one week at the start of the Fall semester.

## FY 2016/2017

- 1. Implementing a lottery by zone for Residential Hall, "green", permit holders. It is understood that to make this new policy change as fair and effective as possible the following provision on the new policy will exist:
  - Department of Housing and Residence Life will make housing assignments earlier.
  - Students who do not receive a Residential Hall permit via the lottery will be eligible for Resident Perimeter, "gold", permit.
  - An additional "gold" lot may needed to accommodate convenient and cheaper parking for residents.

# The Student Government opposes the following proposal:

1. Increasing the Residential Perimeter, "gold", permit price to \$265.
